30° 10' 26" Latitude. ___° 24' 54" Longitude

His instructions are to take out a draft from my personal account at The Bank of England in Fandur, to pay for the extra supplies. We are finding traces of the Carter expedition, as well as some interesting icons. I put that in the note as well.
