A. The **Port of Kandur** is where millions of tonnes of supplies crucial to West Djahar are shipped in, and thousands of tonnes of Copper are shipped out to Great Britain, and other countries. When cruise ships visit (not very often) the Port of Kandur is used to disembark the passengers. Who enjoy West Djaharan hospitality, food, and culture.

H. **Kandur International Airport** is a clean, modern airport handling around 25 flights daily.

D. **Government District** is the seat of government, and where you will get your travel papers.

E. The historic **Red Light District** has been there as long as there were ships coming into the Harbor, in the early 1500s.

F. **Freedom Hill** and B. **Freedom Park** were created to commemorate our peaceful end to British Rule in 1930.

I. The **Hotel District** is described as the very best part of the town. This district also has many fine restaurants.

C. **Abassador Beach** is a quaint, relatively unpolluted narrow strip of beach along the southern edge of the peninsula.
