RE: Psychological Evaluation of Agent Hana Gitelman

In response to Agent Gitelman's request for transfer to Operations from S&T, this evaluation has been prepared for [REDACTED] with a recommendation on AG's suitability for active field service.

SUMMARY EVALUATION: After reviewing Agent Gitelman's case file, conducting personal interviews and completing a full battery of psychological tests, it is apparent that Agent Gitelman exhibits difficulty in understanding the subtext of social interactions as well as difficulty in communicating her own emotional state. These social deficiencies are often indicative of an autistic spectrum disorder, such as Aspergers Syndrome. Her focus makes her ideal for continued work in S&T with codebreaking, signals intelligence and analysis, but raises doubts to her efficacy in active intelligence gathering where subtlety and the ability to read individuals are key.

Moreover, Agent Gitelman's family history (grandmother and mother killed in the [REDACTED]) adds an unstable element to her psychological makeup. In the field, her unresolved feelings for her family members' deaths are likely to surface, and Agent Gitelman is apt to face mental breakdown. This instability makes her a liability to herself, The Institute and other operatives.
